# Funding available to create jobs for young unemployed people

Community Jobs Scotland (CJS) is seeking applications from third sector employers in Fife who are able to create jobs to support young unemployed people.

Up to £5,000 funding is available for each job lasting 39 weeks for 16 to 17-year-olds and 26 weeks for 18 to 24-year-olds.

The majority of jobs created are for young people aged 16-19 years, however jobs can also be created for:

- young people aged 20 to 24 years with additional barriers
- young people aged 16 to 24 years with disabilities
- young people aged 16 to 24 years currently in custody
- young care leavers aged 16 to 24 years
