Frances Hume a biography

Frances Hume has been the Development Officer at Interfaith Scotland for the last seven years. After receiving a degree in Theology at the University of St Andrews in 1998 she worked as a volunteer teacher in India for six months. After returning, she worked as an intern with Christian Aid in Glasgow, before undertaking a Post Graduate Certificate in Secondary Religious and Moral Education. After working as an RME supply teacher she accepted the post of Assistant Development Officer with Save the Children's Young Asylum Seeker and Refugee project in Glasgow where she worked for four years. She also worked with Action of Children as the Development Worker on their young unaccompanied refugee project for two years. In 2006, she accepted the post of Programme Worker with the Iona Community and lived and worked on the island of Iona for six months, before commencing a post with Faith in Community Scotland in Glasgow.

Frances has been involved with Interfaith Scotland (formerly The Scottish Inter Faith Council) since 2004, first as a volunteer and then as the Development Officer with the organisation from July 2007. Frances supports 20 local interfaith groups across Scotland. She co-ordinates Scottish Interfaith Week with at least 60 events taking place each year. She organises 'interfaith days' in schools, and runs workshops for women of faith. She has created interfaith resources for schools, faith and community groups and voluntary and statutory agencies.
