MARAC – Multi-Agency Risk Assessment Conferencing - is a process that identifies highest risk victims of domestic abuse and through multi-agency sharing of information and case discussion, a risk management plan is agreed to reduce the risk to the victim, any children involved and others. You and your staff may be asked to provide information to the MARAC or there may be serious concerns about a victim / family known to your service. This seminar will provide key information about the overall process – Risk Assessment, Referral and Information Sharing and Risk Management Plans.

Target Audience: Staff from statutory and voluntary sectors, particularly from the following MARAC partner agencies:

- Police (local officers, FPU)
- NHS (health visiting, midwifery, addictions, GPs, school nurses)
- Education (School representatives, ICS, Educational Psychology)
- Housing/ Local Services Network
- Social Work (children & families and criminal justice)
- Voluntary Sector, including Women's Aid and sexual abuse agencies

- Increased awareness of risks associated with domestic abuse and the value of an objective risk assessment tool
- Improved understanding of the MARAC process in Fife and practitioner's roles in improving victim safety
- Greater understanding of how MARAC processes can enhance the protection of children living with domestic abuse
